NACA Objectives

The objective of the North American Cruiser Association is to promote the sport of Predicted Log Contests in North America. Pursuant to this objective, NACA will:

1. Publish and distribute a periodic newsletter known as the *Cruiser Log*, which shall contain news and information pertaining to the sport.

2. Schedule and coordinate an annual "North American Invitational" (NAI) Predicted Log Contest.

3. Sanction contests of member associations that are to be scored for NACA points.

4. Maintain and publish scoring and standings of Predicted Log contestants participating in NACA sanctioned contests.

5. Provide perpetual and suitable keeper trophies and other awards for winners of such North American Predicted Log series and events as may be established by NACA.

6. Establish "Recommended Contest Rules" for NACA sanctioned Predic ted Log Contests.

7. Generally be responsive to the needs and requirements of member associations and of the sport of Predicted Log Contests.

8. Support boating and Corinthian yachting in general.

Commodore's Corner

Welcome to NACA for 2008.

I wish you all a happy, healthy, and prosperous new year and trust that your boating will be on smooth waters, with good currents and enjoyable experiences.

I'd especially like to hear that you're taking an active part in predicted log contests in your part of the world. More about that later...

My congratulations to the winners of NAI 2007. I took part, and I want to tell you it was a tough course; everybody had to consider shallow areas and strong winds. Overall, it was a good contest and a great time, due to the sponsorship and efforts of Western Lake Erie Cruiser Association in conjunction with Ottawa River Yacht Club.

I can't express in words the challenge and joy I have received from participating in predicted logging. I believe our sport would be much more popular if more people knew what it's all about. We've got to do a better job letting people know about the challenges and the social repartee that are part and parcel of predicted logging. The fraternizing and griping sessions after the contests are one of the best parts of being a predicted logger.

Now I'd like to talk about some of our goals for 2008 and hope you will make some effort to help attain them.

We need to do more in each of our organizations to introduce more people to predicted logging and get as many newcomers as possible. We need participants with boats, observers, and, yes, guests. We need bodies to join us at every level. Due to lackluster participation, many of our groups are hurting to the point of closing. Older committed members are retiring from boating, and new young blood does not know we exist or what predicted logging is. We need new participants to take up our sport. We need to get the message out. We recently changed the rules to allow contests to be run with a minimum of four boats, down from five, but it's not enough. We need to do more so we'll have five and more boats running. We're talking about incentives for new members to join, and I'm going to recommend to the bridge and board that we eliminate the first year's membership fee for all new members. It's currently only \$10.00, but let's make it free, so there's no risk for someone thinking about joining. It's up to current *(Continued on page 4)*

To All Association Scorers

For those of you who do not know, there are some handy scoring forms on our website that may make your reporting a bit easier. If you go to the helm station at http://www.predictedlog.org/ HelmStation.htm, click on the link labeled, "Association Scorers". Please click there for the scoring form; you will find two versions of the scoring report.

One is a Microsoft Excel spreadsheet that you can download and save as a master form. If you have Excel, you can just fill out the saved master, and then use the "Save As" command and give it any name you like. Then you can e-mail me the file at his@craigandjan.com

The other is a pdf document. You can download it and print copies. Then just fill it in and send it to me by regular mail:

In either case, there is more information than just the contestant points required. Here are the important items that I need:

1. Name of the contest.

2. Date of the contest. If two contests are conducted on a single day, I need to know which was first.

3. Your association name.

4. Contest number (07-X) where X is 1 for your first contest of the season, X is 2 for the second contest of the season, and so on.

Any other information you can give regarding the contest is appreciated.

Please send your contest scores as soon after a race as possible. Thanks very much.
