## NORTH AMERICAN CRUISER ASSOCIATION

## POLICY STATEMENT

I. SCORING & SANCTIONING

A. Mandatory requirements of a NACA contest for sanction areas follows:

- 1 A minimum of three (3) starters.
- 2 A minimum distance of twelve (12) nautical miles.
- 3 No less than four (4) scored legs.

4 A Predicted log/Cruiser Navigation contest is one inwhich the contestant predicts the time it will takehis power cruiser to complete each of a number oflegs comprising a given course. He then runs thecourse without benefit of a timepiece and otherspecified equipment. The contestant with the lowest percentage of error computed by dividing predictedelapsed time into the sum of the errors for each legis the winner of the contest.

B. Requirements for NACA scoring are as follows:

 Contest results must be forwarded to the Association Vice Commodore promptly after each event.
The scoring fee as established shall be enclosed,unless paid in advance.

3. Each contest must be consecutively numbered.

4. Scoring shall be on a NACA approved scoring formwhich provides uniform NACA scoring regardless of thescoring system employed by the local association.

5. Officers have the authority to reject anycontest that does not meet the basic intent of a Predicted log Contest as conducted by the NorthAmerican Cruiser Association.

C. For NACA scoring, the contest year is based on a periodfrom November 1 through October 31.

D. A contestant shall be scored in the chronological order of the contests entered, regardless of the associationsanctioning the contests.

## II. TROPHIES & AWARDS

A. The following perpetual trophies have been established andwill be awarded each year, together with suitable keepertrophies:

Page 1

North American Championship --- Coastal Explorer Perpetual Trophy --- Highest score in up to eight of the first ninecontests entered.

NACA High Point Queen Mary Perpetual Trophy ---Highest score in up to ten of the first eleven contestsentered.

NACA Championship Four --- St. Petersburg Yacht Club Trophy--- Highest score in up to four of the first five contestsentered.

Herbert L. Stone Perpetual Trophy --- Highest score fromfirst, second, and third place finishes in the first sevencontests entered.

George W. Codrington Perpetual Trophy --- Highest score  ${\tt \dot{u}p}$  to five of the first seven contests entered.

In the order listed above, the winner in one category shallbe ineligible for an award in any of the subsequent categories.

North American Invitational Perpetual Trophy --- Awarded to the winner of the annual North American Invitational Cruiser Navigation Contest.

B. The following awards will be made annually withoutperpetual trophies:

TOP TEN --- The ten top scorers with the highest scores inup to eight of the first nine contests entered will eachreceive a keeper award.

ASSOCIATION AWARD -- The top contestant, based on standingsin the NACA Championship listing, in any association inwhich a contestant did not receive a national award in one of the categories listed above shall receive a keepertrophy.

500 CLUB AWARD --- Awarded to each contestant scoring under0.500%, on a raw score without handicap in a NACAsanctioned contest.

C. The following special award may be made at the discretion of the NACA Executive Committee upon recommendation of theprior recipients of the award. LOU GANDELMAN HALL OFCHAMPIONS - Louis L. Gandelman Perpetual Trophy - Awardedin recognition of outstanding contributions to the sport ofCruiser Navigation.

## III. PUBLICATIONS

A newsletter to be known as THE CRUISER LOG shall be published atleast six times each year to include cumulative NACA scores.

On a regular basis publish a roster of members, both individualand Association; Bylaws and Recommended Contest Rules.

IV. MANAGEMENT OF THE ASSOCIATION

This Association shall be managed by a group of Officers and aBoard of Directors whose election, duties, responsibilities andauthority shall be as specified in its Bylaws.
